A local couple came in one Lord's Day who stated that they were looking for a church. Since he was raised "Catholic" and his wife "Pentecostal" they were hoping to find a church that might be a good blend of both! Mr. Hamilton says, "I suspect they were not successful in finding such a church that morning! However, they heard the gospel that day, and we pray that it will bear fruit."

Pray that others will come in from the district, even out of curiosity, and hear the words of life. One particular recent blessing was the presence in a morning service of Bill, a friend of Mr. Hamilton's from the soccer league. He came with his daughter particularly to thank Mr. Hamilton and the congregation for their prayers over the last few months. Please pray for Bill, who is being treated for cancer, that he will know God's blessing physically and spiritually. Mr. Hamilton gave him a Bible earlier this year and has encouraged the congregation to pray for him and a number of other soccer players with whom Mr. Hamilton has had good conversations.

There have been several bereavements in the congregation within a short period of time. Two of the folk lost their fathers and one a stepfather. Pray for the Lord's comfort for these families. In one case Mr. Hamilton had visited the father of a church member on several occasions and had very encouraging spiritual conversations. They believe the man died in the hope of the gospel, since he gave clear testimony on his deathbed. Please pray for the blessing of God upon the Word that was preached at the funeral. Several unsaved who were present commented on the message to family members later that day.

The church family is thankful for the arrival of baby Ezekiel Fritz on July 14. His parents are members of the church. He will be well looked after, no doubt, by his 15-month-old sister, Keliyah.

For the first time in some years the church had several young people go to the FPC youth camp. Five of the youth attended for the first time. The church was praying that the week would be a highlight in their spiritual experience.

On Thursday evening June 8, the communicant membership of Covenant FPC met for the purpose of electing up to three elders. The meeting was conducted by its interim session made up of Rev. Colin Mercer, Mr. Tim Farr, and Dr. Ed Dunbar. All three men who stood for office—Bryan Barwick, Duaine Hamilton, and Paul Peters—were elected. There will be a meeting on Thursday, July 27, to ordain and install these men in their offices. Pray that God would bless that service with His presence and that He would bless these men with the wisdom, faith, and grace that they will need to carry out their new responsibilities as elders.

Kim Wagner had an MRI in June which indicated that the new meningioma that was discovered in May of last year and which received Gamma Knife (GK) radiation has grown significantly in the last six months. The Wagners met with their radiation oncologist a couple of weeks ago to see if the new tumor could receive another GK treatment to slow its growth. While the doctor said that a second treatment would be scheduled, he wanted Kim to meet first with a medical oncologist to see whether she would be a candidate for a drug that has shown some effectiveness in inhibiting tumor growth in meningiomas. As a result of that meeting, Kim is scheduled to have a series of special radioisotope scans the last week of July to see whether her tumors are susceptible to the drug. If they are, then she will receive a monthly injection of the drug for the rest of her life. The GK treatment will still be administered as soon as the other scans have been completed. The Wagners thank all who continue to uphold them in prayer and simply ask that you pray for God to give them wisdom and grace for the ongoing trial.
