News and Prayer Requests from the Free Presbyterian Churches of North America

REV. STEPHEN HAMILTON Lehigh Valley Free Presbyterian

Allentown, Pennsylvania

The congregation in the Lehigh Valley continues to pray for the Lord to build His church. They have had occasional visitors, including one woman who came recently after hearing of the church on Sermonaudio.com. Like many who already attend, she came a good distance. They are praying that God would bring in folks within the Lehigh Valley or at least from a reasonable driving distance. One couple who attended for over eighteen months and others who came sporadically during this year have ceased to attend. Distance has been quoted as a factor by some. While not a new problem, it is a real difficulty, especially in the wintertime.

After Mrs. Hamilton's surgery to remove her thyroid in August, the pathology showed there had been cancer in an attached nodule which had broken out and affected the thyroid. This was quite a shock to the Hamiltons. On November 14 Mrs. Hamilton saw an endocrinologist who recommended that she have radioactive iodine treatment to kill any cancer cells that could have been left behind. Please pray the treatment will be successful and without any severe side effects. The Lord has given great peace in this situation. Please also pray for the full return of Mrs. Hamilton's voice. She is still quite hoarse and unable to sing.

On November 5 the Moberg family—Mitchell, Lisa, and their two daughters—were involved in a car wreck on their way to church. Apart from some bumps and bruises, the ladies were not badly hurt. Mitch, however, had a bad compound fracture of his left elbow. He had surgery to insert plates and wires to repair the bones but will need further surgery to repair damaged tendons. While the family is thankful for preserving grace, they have some uncertainty about the future since Mitch will be laid aside from his truck-driving job for many months. There are health insurance issues to be ironed out also. Pray for God's continued mercy and provision.

Mr. Hamilton and Rev. Stephen Pollock have begun what they hope will be a regular series of meetings to pray for their respective works. They had a time of prayer together in Malvern, and later that evening Mr. Hamilton preached at the Malvern church's prayer meeting. The next prayer time will take place at the Lehigh Valley church with Dr. Pollock preaching at their church prayer meeting. Pray that God will visit both of these ministries with great blessing in coming days.

Mr. Hamilton was greatly encouraged by a call from a young man in his mid-20s whose family had attended the Lehigh Valley church many years ago before moving out of state. When the young man was ten years old, he had asked the Lord to save him after hearing a message preached by Mr. Hamilton. He never told Mr. Hamilton about it. Now, some sixteen years later, he found the message on Sermonaudio.com that was preached back in 2001 when he was converted. It stirred his heart all over again, and, with thankfulness to the Lord for saving him, he called Mr. Hamilton to tell his story. As this call encouraged Mr. Hamilton, he says, "May it encourage our people to pray on and our ministers to keep preaching the gospel to their congregations. We often have no idea what the Lord is doing in our midst."

Another MRI to be scheduled for sometime in January will determine what effect the radiation is having on the tumor. Mr. Wagner says, "Thank you all so much for continuing to remember us before the Lord."
